Also a highly sought-after speaker and workers’ compensation consultant, Emslie thrives on building talented and capable teams, providing mentoring and inspiration to guide and support others.

The founder of Women Executives in Workers’ Compensation (WEIWC), Emslie works with a diverse group of women in workers’ comp to collaborate and share industry knowledge about emerging trends in comp. Her nonprofit think tank helps equip women with knowledge and experience needed to excel in the workers’ compensation field.

Starting as a sales representative for a pharmacy benefit management company, Emslie established her expertise in PBM operations and pricing and began working her way up the industry ladder, eventually establishing and growing her own PBM auditing company, ProsperRx. Her company provided payers with valuable insight into workers’ comp processes, state regulations, pricing strategies, service expectations and program functionality, as well as expert analysis of the accuracy and cost-effectiveness of PBM services.

Joining myMatrixx as president in January 2012, Emslie has grown the mid-size, privately held workers’ compensation PBM in revenue, staff and profitability. Her long list of accomplishments at myMatrixx includes launching initiatives to drive innovation, improve efficiency and increase client satisfaction and employee engagement.

Also an active member of the Workers Compensation Research Institute Core Funders Group for the past five years and on the advisory board of Kids’ Chance since 2014, Emslie continues to advance and create opportunities in the field of workers’ compensation through her innovative ideas and knowledge. Under her leadership, myMatrixx partnered with the University of South Florida to create their first College of Pharmacy PhD fellowship program for managed care clinical pharmacists, independent researchers and educators in a variety of health care settings. Additionally, Emslie is currently working with USF faculty and administrators to further a “work ready” program with the USF College of Nursing and to develop an entrepreneur track within the USF College of Business.

“Her nature to give back has helped her succeed and she freely shares her knowledge with her peers, clients and professionals throughout the industry,” notes a coworker and nominator. Emslie, like many women today, artfully juggles family and career, while advancing the field of workers’ compensation and thriving on new challenges.
